NEW BUILD – phase 1 handed over

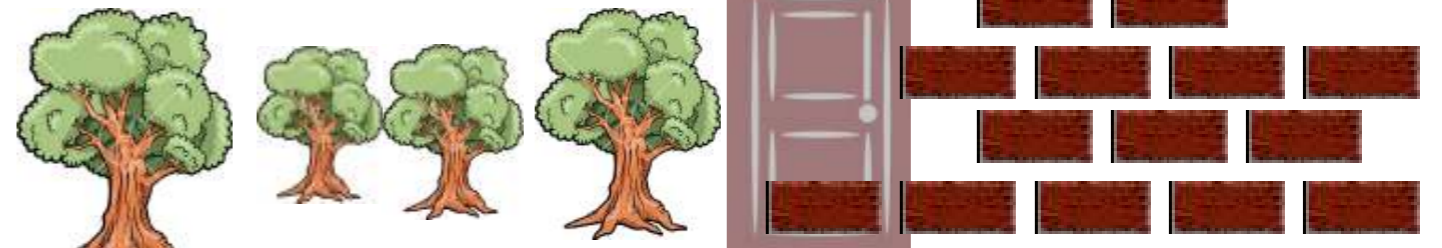

Show your support and Buy-A-Brick

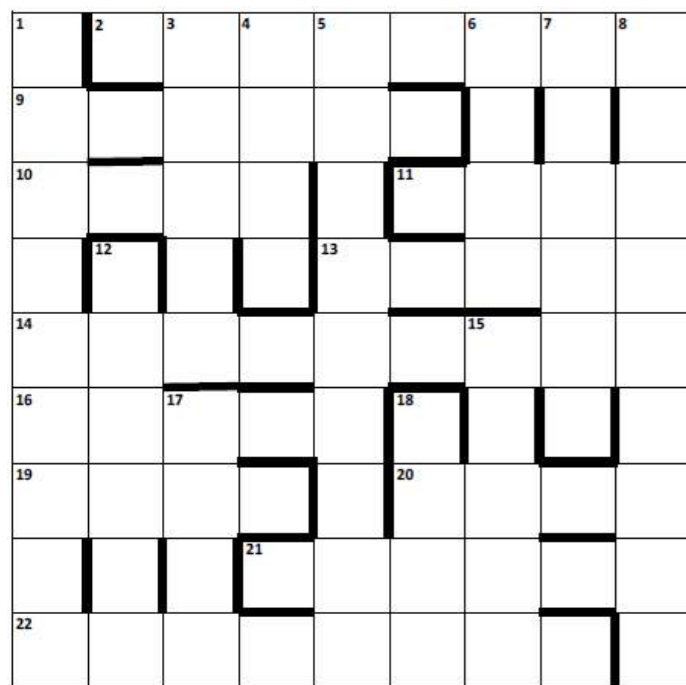
